Union with the West Church



On Sunday 2nd March, both congregations from St Mary's and Haddington West voted in

favour of the Basis of Union.

This means that the union itself is now likely to happen in **October** after Rev John Vischer moves on from the West Church. The new united congregation will be called *Haddington Parish Church* but the building that we will all worship in will be St Mary's.

The Coordinating Group, made up of the minister and four elders from each Kirk Session, has been meeting regularly and will continue to do so. They will next meet on Tuesday 3rd June. The group's purpose is to plan joint working and other aspects of the union. St. Mary's is represented by our Interim Moderator, Rev Muriel Willoughby, our Session Clerk, Rae Goode along with Shirley

Patterson, Mary McMillan and Stewart Meikle.

Please speak to any of the group if you have any questions or comments. Equally, we would welcome any suggestions you have about joint activities that we could organise to bring the two congregations closer together as we approach the union.

Following the union, we will take the required steps towards calling a minister for the new united congregation.

This is a time of change and uncertainty for everyone, but it also opens up many exciting opportunities for the future of the church in Haddington.

This is our church, and we all have a part to play.

Stamp Project



Here at St Mary's, we have been supporting the Church of Scotland's Stamp Appeals for several years now. In 2025/2026 the appeal is supporting the Al Ahli Arab Hospital in Gaza.

This hospital in Northern Gaza has been in operation since 1882. It is owned and run by the Anglican Diocese of Jerusalem, a partner Church of the Church of Scotland. The hospital is the only Christian hospital in the Gaza Strip and Gaza's only cancer hospital. It normally handles around 300 surgeries and 600 radiological and a total of 3,000 outpatient visits per month. It is supported by international charities such as Embrace the Middle East. In times of calm during the occupation of Gaza, Al Ahli Hospital runs as any normal hospital with varying departments and an Accident and Emergency dealing with the usual day to day ailments of a population.

Since the beginning of the conflict in Gaza in October 2023, the hospital has conducted emergency operations 24 hours per day, operating on 30-35 people per day. This was in addition to hundreds of medical consultations carried out each day at Al Ahli Hospital and its field clinic in Khan Younis. As well as serving as a hospital, it also provided a shelter for thousands of residents who fled their homes in northern Gaza seeking safety from Israeli airstrikes. Unfortunately, the hospital was hit by a fatal air strike killing and wounding several hundred people including children.

Despite all, and through all the bombing, the hospital continued to serve the population in whatever way they could with the small resources they had, with staff working hours under difficult conditions.

Archbishop Hosam of the Episcopal Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East has requested all of us to join him in the following prayer: "Please pray with us that this wave of violence will be stopped, as there are no winners in wars. All are losers", he said.

Christian Aid Week

The Haddington Churches' Joint Service was held on Sunday 11th May, in St Mary's Parish Church, conducted by Rev Liz O'Ryan and Rev John Vischer. The Christian Aid Week stories, which were presented by lay members and friends of the local committee, took us to Guatemala, a country dealing with immense challenges. It is one of the 10 countries in the world, rated most vulnerable to climate emergencies. The church was well-filled and there was a warm feeling of fellowship among the supporters. £867 was raised at the service and another £390 raised online at the time of going to press.

80th Anniversary of Christian Aid

2025 marks the 80th anniversary of CA's founding by churches in Britain. Rev Douglas Lister was the Church of Scotland minister who first asked churches to support European refugees after the Second World War. There was a special service to mark the 80th anniversary in St Giles' Cathedral, Edinburgh on Saturday 17 May.




